Our Public Health Nurse is Whaea Rebecca (Tangata tiriti / Te Ātiawa). She visits our kura regularly. She is available to discuss hauora for tamariki, growth and development, skin and ear infections, sore throats and rheumatic fever, asthma, allergies, eczema, head lice, wetting and soiling, hearing, vision or dental concerns and immunisations.

Public Health Nurses work together with whānau and the kura to promote hauora of tamariki and rangatahi. They also offer the school based immunisation programme, including Boostrix (diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis) boosters in Year 7, and HPV (human papillomavirus) vaccine to year 8 students. They can also visit to offer catch up immunisations like the MMR which protects against measles, mumps and rubella.

### Vision Screening for Tau 7 & 8 - Rāapa 19 o Hui tanguru 2025

If you do not want your child's vision to be screened, please let the Tari know asap. Results of vision screening will be sent home with your child. The results may be shared with the school, including your child's teacher.

Children already wearing glasses/contact lenses or under the care of an Optometrist will not be tested; their status will be recorded as 'under care'.

### Polyfest Campaign for 2025

### Blanket Permission Slip for Tamaki Makaurau

To make this a little easier for whānau & kaiako, a blanket permission slip will be created to cover haerenga that occur within Tāmaki (from Silverdale in the north to Bombay in the south) during the course of a Kura day and conclude prior to the end of a normal kura day.

Where a haerenga involves risk assessed to be greater than that associated with the average Kura day, for example, rock climbing or the haerenga continues overnight, a specific permission slip will be distributed for each event. At the time of our seeking any further permission you will also be asked to update health and contact information held by the Kura.

It is important that this permission slip is completed at the start of the year for all students who will be participating in haerenga (as described above). Details on the permission slip will remain confidential to school staff. It is crucial that you provide us with the most accurate information.

Please note that it is very important that student details such as health information and emergency contacts are kept up to date with the Tari during the year.

## KEY INFORMATION

### Kutu/Head Lice

We have had a couple reports of kutu here at kura, please check your tamariki and keep them home until clear to avoid spreading. More information can be found [here](#).
